

Grace Williams, Founder, Board President, & Executive Director

Grace was born and raised in northern California and received her BA in Applied Linguistics in 2006 from Trinity Western University in British Columbia, Canada. During her time there, she was involved in a ministry to people suffering in commercial sexual exploitation in Vancouver. After spending several years in religious communities, she discerned a call to work with survivors of human trafficking. Grace began volunteering with Mary's Guest House for adult trafficked survivors (San Diego, CA) and the Missionaries of Charity's Homeless Women's Shelter (Memphis, TN).

As she became more involved in the anti-trafficking movement and attended training with Treasures International (Los Angeles, CA) and educational meetings with the Bilateral Safety Corridor Coalition, she saw the pressing need for more rehabilitative programs in San Diego that have a therapeutic/holistic approach, and most importantly which present the Gospel of Jesus Christ.

In December of 2015, Grace was elected co-chair of the San Diego Board of Supervisors' Human Trafficking Victim Service Committee. In this role, she helps lead the committee in representing the needs of trafficking victims and working to further best aftercare practices.
